
Wishing you all a well-deserved half-term holiday, and we look forward to hearing about what the children have been up to on their return.

Robins do a **Show & Tell** every **Friday** afternoon. Children are encouraged to bring in an item, story, toy or something they made that is special to them. Show & Tell helps children to learn how to speak in front of an audience, builds their confidence, develop listening skills and practice using descriptive language. It is also a lot of fun and allows me to get to know your child(ren) better!

It will be kept in a Show & Tell box until the afternoon and we discourage playing with them at school. Show & Tell is voluntary and children do not have to participate every week, but I would encourage it.




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Early Years Curriculum Overview

Communication and Language

Listening and Attention 40-60 'maintains attention, concentrates and sits quietly during appropriate activity.' 'Two-channelled attention – can listen and do for a short span.'

Understanding 40-60 'Responds to instructions involving a two-part sequence.' 'Listens and responds to ideas expressed by others in conversation or discussion.'

Speaking 40-60 'Uses talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events.'

Physical Development

Moving and Handling 40-60 'negotiates space successfully...' 'shows a preference for a dominant hand' 'begins to form recognisable letters.'

Health and Self-Care 40-60 – 'shows some understanding that good practices, with regard to exercise, eating, sleeping and hygiene, can contribute to good health.', 'shows understanding of the need for safety...'

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Self-Confidence and Self Awareness 40-60 'confident to speak to others about own needs, wants, interests and opinions'

Managing Feelings and Behaviour 40-60 'Aware of the boundaries set, and of behaviour expectations in the setting'

Making relationships 40-60 'Initiates conversations, attends to and takes account of what others say.'**Relationships 40-60** Initiates conversations, attends to and takes account of what others say.'

Literacy

Reading 40-60 'Hears and says the initial sounds in words'' 'links sounds to letters' 'uses vocabulary and forms of speech that are increasingly influenced by their experience of books', 'enjoys an increasing range of books'.

Writing 40-60 'gives meaning to marks they make as they draw, write and paint' 'begins to break the flow of speech into words' hears and says initial sounds in words' 'uses some ...identifiable letters to communicate meaning' 'links sounds to letters' 'writes own name ...'.

Mathematics

Numbers 40-60 'recognises numerals 1 to 5', 'counts, saying one number name for each item.' 'counts actions or objects to 10.'

Shape, Space and Measure 40-60 'beginning to use mathematical names for Shapes', 'selects a particular named shape', 'can describe their relative position such as 'behind' or 'next to'.

Understanding the World

People and communities 40-60 'enjoys joining in with family customs and routines'.

The world 40-60 'looks closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change'.

Technology 40-60 'uses ICT hardware to interact with age appropriate computer software'.

Expressive Arts and Design

Exploring and using media and materials 40-60 'begins to build a repertoire of songs and dances' 'experiments with different textures' 'constructs with a purpose in mind, using a variety of resources.', 'manipulates materials to achieve a planned effect'.

Being imaginative 40-60 'create simple representations.....', 'plays alongside other children who are engaged in the same theme'



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General Reminders



Things to Remember:

- Please ensure that your child's reading books and reading record are in their bags every day. We ask that you read with your child for 5 minutes, at least three times each week, and sign your child's reading record.
- Please could all items of clothing (including coats) and belongings be **named**. That way we can return any items that may have been misplaced.
- Please ensure your child brings in a **named water bottle** every day. The children will have access to their bottles throughout the day, and they can be re-filled when needed.
- Please ensure that your child wears appropriate clothing for the season, including a **hooded waterproof** jacket, a hat, scarf and a pair of gloves may be necessary, as the weather starts to change.
- **Forest School** is every Thursday afternoon. School uniform should be worn and waterproofs will go on over clothes. If children do not have their own waterproofs, the school has spare available.
- Please send in spare clothing in your child's bag every day, in case of accidents, or getting wet outside, etc.



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
