

Chicks Class Newsletter Curriculum Information

Curriculum – Early Years Foundation Stage

The areas of the curriculum we will be focusing on this term are as follows:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Making relationships:

- Talking about their feelings in more elaborated ways
- Set and work towards simple goals, being able to wait for what they want and control their immediate impulses when appropriate

Communication and Language, Speaking:

- Understand simple questions about 'who' 'what' and 'where'
- Can start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns

Literacy, Reading:

- Ask questions about their favourite books and seek them out to share with an adult, friend or to look at alone.
- Develop play around favourite stories using props

Physical development, Moving and Handling:

• Match their developing physical skills to tasks and activities in the setting, e,g. They decide whether to crawl, walk or run across a plank, depending on its length and width.

Maths, Numbers

- Talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes
- Understand position through words alone

Understanding of the World, People and Communities:

- Explore how things work
- Plant seeds and care for growing plants.

Expressive Art and Design, Exploring and Using Media and Materials:

- Explore colour and colour-mixing
- Listen with increased attention to sounds

Uniform

We ask that children wear sensible, durable clothing appropriate for all seasons and all play activities. Examples include joggers, leggings, T-shirts and jumpers or cardigans. Supportive, closed footwear, such as school shoes, trainers or plimsolls are best. Children need a hooded coat every day to ensure that they can play outside. We will also send prompts throughout the year about more seasonal clothing, such as hats, gloves, scarves and sun hats.

Uniform is not compulsory in Pre-School, however, if you would like your child to wear the school uniform, our uniform for children up to Year 4 is as follows:

School uniform:

- White or navy polo-shirt (school logo available)
- Dark grey school trousers with grey/black socks
- Dark grey school skirt or pinafore with white socks or navy tights
- Black school shoes
- Navy V-neck or round neck jumper (school logo available)
- Navy cardigan (school logo available)

Forest School

Chicks will be having **Forest School** every **Thursday**. The children will need to wear **school uniform,** but we ask that you provide a waterproof outer layer and a pair of wellies to change into. These can be left in school on your child's peg, or brought in to school every Thursday.

Forest School Kit

During your child's allocated Forest School session, they will need a suitable Forest School kit. Although this is dependent on the season and the activity, we would generally recommend the following items:

- Wellies / Outdoor walking boots or shoes
- Waterproof salopettes / waterproof splash-suit / waterproof trousers and jacket
- Warm layers, when required

Please note that these items are likely to get dusty, dirty and sometimes wet, so please ensure they are practical and durable, but not expensive, items.





Chicks Class Newsletter General Reminders

- Once your child has been given reading books and a reading record, please ensure
 they are in their bags every day. We ask that you read with your child for 5 minutes,
 at least three times each week, and sign your child's reading record.
- Please could all items of clothing (including coats) and belongings be named. That
 way we can return any items that may have been misplaced.
- Please ensure your child brings in a **water bottle** every day. The children will have access to their bottles throughout the day, and they can be re-filled when needed.
- Please ensure that your child wears appropriate clothing for the season, including a
 hooded waterproof jacket, sunhat, sun glasses and sun cream in the spring summer
 months; and a warm hat and gloves during the colder months.
- Please can we ask that all children have a full change of clothes in their bag at all times, with a plastic bag for used clothes, in case of any accidents or children getting wet/muddy through play. Some children will require multiple changes of clothes.
