What a fantastic start we have had to this new half-term. The weather has been wonderful (dare I say it, a bit too hot for some of us!) and the children have been excited and motivated to return to their learning. I am delighted to see how well the pupils have taken their new routine in their stride and even more delighted to notice the positive impact this is already having on our day-to-day engagement in learning. The children are starting their day calmly and ready for their learning experiences, as well as having greater opportunities to develop their reading fluency. This is bound to have a real positive impact on learning overall. Thank you for supporting your children through this change, it really is making a difference.

This week I have had the opportunity to invite some of our Governors into school to share a number of aspects of our day, including our phonics provision, science curriculum updates, progress in our positive behaviour strategies and review of our attendance. We have had a very busy start to the term for Chicks class. We got to release them in forest school, which was really exciting and it has been great watching and learning about the life cycle of a caterpillar. Chicks have enjoyed taking some risks in their play this week after we introduced a step ladder to build towers that could be bigger than the children. The children felt very important and grown up and were so excited and eager to play, but first learnt how to be safe and feel safe in their play. The children soon became knowledgeable about taking safe, controlled risks and had fun building and counting the towers to see whose was the tallest, but we think Mrs Ziccardi had an unfair advantage!









'The Robin's have started their new topic called A Pirate's Life this half term! They have read the book The Night Pirates this week, which has supported our literacy learning on repetition and similes! The children have really impressed me with their enthusiasm to use repetition in their writing!'

This week the children released their butterflies! They have worked hard learning all about the butterfly life cycle and how to care for them. We went down to forest school and spoke about how our butterflies had changed from the caterpillars we started with and then we worked one by one to release the butterflies from their exhibit! The children got very close to the butterflies and enjoyed seeing all their detail!










Kites

Class Dojo Awards

Wow! Can you believe it! Some children are starting to earn their first Golden Tickets already!

Children earn a Golden Ticket after receiving 100 Dojos, a great achievement and recognition of their wonderful behaviours in learning and day to day actions.



what is a Golden Ticket?

Each golden ticket is earned when pupils reach 100 Dojos, and every integer of 100 following. This may take a little while to earn, but will definitely be worth it!

Children can earn their Golden Ticket to use for a range of individual Golden Times - see some of our suggestions below;





what is Golden Time?

Similar to a Golden Ticket, Golden Time is a reward earned at a particular interval for pupils. This time though, we focus on whole class rewards. When a class reach 1000 Dojos, they have collectively earned Golden Time. Using their value of democracy, pupils vote together with their teacher on how to 'spend' their Golden Time as a class. Suggestions for Golden Tickets above can be used as a class reward, but this list is not endless and all children are encouraged to think of their own ideas for rewards. If these are within reason, then it is likely we will make it happen.








Online Gaming

Most young people have positive experiences socialising online, but it can be easy for young people to share things or post things they wish they hadn't.

The simplest way to have information about your child removed from a website, or app is to contact the site itself. Read reporting to social media sites for more information.

Social media can offer young people opportunities to express themselves and have fun, but they could be exposed to harmful content which might include sexual images or videos which could impact on their understanding of sex and relationships.


